Concern for the Church Colossians 2:1-7

1. By or through his concern for the church, Paul hoped that the Colossians would know the fullness of Christ and find encouragement and unity together. 2:2-3

The purpose of Paul's concern was that the Colossians might be encouraged in heart and united in love. 2:2

Paul's intermediate goal for the Colossians was that they would have the full riches of complete understanding.

Paul's ultimate goal was for the Colossian church to know the mystery of God, Jesus Christ.

Christ is the one in whom is to be found all that one needs in order to understand spiritual reality and to lead a life pleasing to God. 2:3

Am I an encouragement to my church and do l contribute to the unity of my church because of my growing personal knowledge of Christ?

2. Paul expresses theological and personal reasons for his concern for the Colossians. 2:4-7

Paul does not want the Colossians to be deceived by "fine sounding" theological arguments. 2:4

Paul's personal concern regarded his physical absence. 2:5

In making specific application of these things to the Colossians, Paul's primary concern was that they continue to grow in Christ. 2:6-7

The Colossians were to continue to be rooted, built up, and strengthened in their faith in Christ. 2:7

The Colossians were to be overflowing with thankfulness.
