# Disappointment

#### Luke 7:18-35

## Disappointment: sadness or displeasure caused by the nonfulfillment of one's hopes or expectations.

## 1. There will be times when I will experience disappointment and doubt as I follow Jesus Christ.

John understood what Jesus was teaching and doing, but it was not what John expected. Was Jesus really the Christ?


Sooner or later, I will need to come to terms with my own disappointment with Jesus Christ.

## When I am disappointed with and God, the best thing I can do is tell him so and then pay attention for his response.

2. Jesus does not attempt to meet my expectations but points to a reality containing enough evidence of his activity to produce faith.

Jesus' ministry was to preach the good news of the kingdom, reverse the taint of sin on creation, and restore our relationship with God.

Jesus will do what he is supposed to do regardless of my expectations. I am invited to trust him so that I do not fall away and lose faith.




**Following Christ means** the path forward is not the certain or familiar path, but the one requiring faith. Am I able to recognize God's presence and activity?

3. Jesus does not condemn John for feeling disappointment but rebukes the selfcentered unbelief of the Scribes and Pharisees.

Jesus describes John as the greatest man ever born, despite John's doubts. He is a forerunner and herald of God's kingdom.

The parable of the brats makes clear that people miss out on God's kingdom not because of their disappointment with the ministry style and personality of the messenger, but because their selfcenteredness causes them to reject the message.



Is the root of my disappointment with God my selfcenteredness? Do l expect God to come to me on my terms so l don't have to go to Him on his terms?
