2. The evil in my heart is revealed sooner or later in the things I say. 3:7-12

My tongue, or my words, stubbornly resist bending to my will. 3:7-8

I can alter my life to conform to expectations of godliness, but my words will reveal the truth of my godliness, or my lack of it.

"What goes into a man's mouth does not make him 'unclean,' but what comes out of his mouth, that is what makes him 'unclean.' ... Don't you see that whatever enters the mouth goes into the stomach and then out of the body?

But the things that come out of the mouth come from the heart, and these make a man 'unclean.' For out of the heart come evil thoughts, murder, adultery, sexual immorality, theft, false testimony, slander. These are what make a man 'unclean'; but eating with unwashed hands does not make him 'unclean.'" Matthew 15:11, 17-20

"...by your words you will be acquitted, and by your words you will be condemned." Matthew 12:37

If my words are going to reveal what is in my heart regardless of my best efforts to keep it hidden away, then my only hope is to allow Jesus to change my heart.

"Make a tree good and its fruit will be good, or make a tree bad and its fruit will be bad, for a tree is recognized by its fruit...For out of the overflow of the heart the mouth speaks." Matthew 12:33-34
