

1. The Holy Spirit unites me with other believers in a local church. 12:12-13

Through the work of the Spirit, Christians experience unity as a spiritual reality in the local church.

The purpose of the Spirit's activity is to form believers into one body.

2. The Spirit, deliberately and by design, places believers in a unified and diverse local church to best meet both individual and corporate needs. 12:14-20, 27-31

Because the unity is spiritual, not the result of any other determining factor, the members of the local church will be very different from one another and this is for the good of the individual and the church.

3. The unity in diversity created by God's Spirit combines with the mission given by God to produce the fellowship in the local church I need to go the distance in my walk with Christ. 12:21-26

The fellowship in the local church appears to consist first of a commitment to the larger purposes that naturally come with being united in Christ.

The fellowship in the local church consists secondly in the intimate love for and understanding of one another. We are committed to Christ and his mission, and we are committed to one another.
