1. Having faith means I believe THAT God's word is true. I assent to the facts of who Jesus is and what he accomplishes.

Mary will give birth to a Son who is to be named Jesus, or "God Saves." Jesus will save his people from their sins.




Both Jesus' identity and mission fulfill Old Testament prophecy.



Jesus is God with us, God in the flesh, yet still completely God.

2. Having faith means I will believe IN Jesus: I will trust him personally enough to act on what God says.

The Candle of Faith




First, Joseph was to take Mary home to be his wife. 1:20

Secondly, Joseph was to claim the child as his own and give him the name Jesus. 1:21

This is the crisis of belief for Joseph. What he does next reveals what he believes regardless of what he says. 1:24-25

Faith means I personally trust and believe Jesus enough to act on what God has said and done, regardless of the personal cost to me.



What has God said and done recently that require me to trust Him? What actions can I take that will reveal my personal trust in Jesus?

I invite you to consider what the Bible is telling you about Jesus: conceived by the Spirit, sent to save us from our sin, sent to fulfill ancient promises, and sent to reveal that God is with us. What do you believe to be true about Jesus?
